C: Character matters. Are we trying to live like Jesus? What would Jesus do?

- We hosted the Diocesan Fall President's Meeting in October 2023 and attended the Diocesan Spring Retreat, the Development Days and the recent CWL Information Session promoting the Outreach Program.
- We loved the social face to face celebrations of our beloved Fancy Hat Tea Party and the recent Christmas Gift, Craft and Bake Sale. We so appreciate seeing new volunteers working alongside our well experienced members. All of these events, whether fulfilling the criteria of our Faith, Service or Social and Ecological Justice Ministries, require tremendous leadership, time, donations and we are so much better together.

We have met our Christmas commitments to our Church, the staff and local charities. A cheque, in the amount of \$187.30 which was collected from our members over the past year, has been submitted to the Development and Peace 1% Program. Our Membership is at 120. We have 3 members who have renewed for 2024 also. Our Membership Drive is booked for the weekends of January 6th and 7th and January 13th and 14th before and after the Masses. The Membership Fee is thirty-five dollars (\$35.00). Please encourage new and renewing members to see us at one of the three (3) stations in our Church.

Service Committee - Joan McCann (Chair), Angel MacKinnon and Maureen Plunkett

At our October 2nd General Meeting invited guest speakers Michael and Michelle Schwartz (Katarokwi Union of Tenants) spoke about their *Feed The People Program* and related involvement with the Integrated Care Hub on Montreal Street. Their volunteer work includes collecting and delivering supplies such as clothing and camping gear – in addition to food. The "Hub" provides Consumption and Treatment Services (CTS) operated by Kingston Community Health Centres (KCHC/Street Health Centre.

Through a joint fund-raising effort between the CWL and the parish community of St Joseph's Catholic Church we were able to raise approximately \$1,777.00. This was presented to Michael and Michelle for their campaign. For approximately \$300.00 - \$350.00 they can provide one lunch for 80 - 100 people.

Social and Ecological Justice - Barb Quinn (Chair), Alice Gazeley and Jane Watts

Speaker Series: We have had some interesting Speakers.

Patricia Streich talked about "The Affordable Housing Crisis" in Kingston. Speculators are buying up buildings and are able to charge whatever rent they want.

Michael Schwarz spoke about The Kingston Union of Tenants. His wife Michelle spoke about *Feed the People*. Both help at the HUB on Montreal Street. They have fund raisers to provide lunches at the HUB. A collection from CWL and some parishioners raised over \$1777.00. Some of this money will be used to provide a Christmas dinner on Christmas Eve which our CWL members will be helping to cook and serve.

In November we presented "The Red Dress Project", to remember our Indigenous missing and murdered Women and Girls. A prayer service was held and afterwards a little red dress with a name of a missing or murdered Woman or Girl was available to take home to pray for and research her story.

We continue to collect and recycle small item like milk bags, pill bottles, bottle caps, pop can tabs, and other items.
