Fr. Cosmas Reflection

Faith in a time of crisis

It's easy to delude ourselves into thinking we have a strong faith when everything in our world is calm and smooth. It's only when the storm strikes that we discover what kind of faith we have, or if we have any faith at all. Faith here means not so much belief in God as trust in God.

Some people think that if God was with them, and if he really cared about them, then no storm would ever hit them. Life would be all plain sailing. So, when a storm does come, they immediately think that God has abandoned them. But today's Gospel story shows that this is not so. The storm still hit the apostles even though Jesus was present with them in the boat.

What real faith does is assure us that God is with us in the midst of the storm. It is that conviction that we are not alone, which enables us to get through the storm.

When the storm suddenly hit the apostles, what happened? Their faith failed them and they were overcome with fear. We can deduce this from what Jesus said to them: 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' However, in their fear they cried out, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!'

They cry of the apostle, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' offers comfort to us. It is a cry made by many, and probably by ourselves, when danger strikes and God seems not to care or even to be found. At such times we discover how little our faith really is. But our faith doesn't have to be perfect. Even a little faith can get us through. Gandhi said, 'A person with a grain of faith in God never loses hope, because he ever believes in the ultimate triumph of truth.'

There is a lesson here for us. If we cannot or will not seek God in the quiet moment of our lives, we are not likely to find him when trouble strikes. We are more likely to panic. But if we have learnt to seek him and to trust him in the quiet moments, then most certainly we will find him when the going gets rough.

Life can be compared to a voyage. Through each of us has to pilot our own little craft, the life of a Christian is not meant to be a solo voyage. We journey with our fellow Christians, and thus are able to support one another in times of difficulty. One of the shortest prayers ever composed was written by a French sailor. It goes like this: 'Lord my boat is small and the ocean is great.' (Flor McCarthy, SDB)
